Curriculum

Our first project throughout the Spring term will be is 'Our Wonderful World' with our big question being '**How can we save the planet?**'

We will kick start this topic with our 'The Snow Queen' themed launch day. This will introduce our literacy text and the children will transform our classroom into a winter wonderland. We will also be creating mini ice sculptures and intricate snowflake designs.

There are ideas for topic-related learning you could do at home in addition to the children's Home Learning (see below). However, these activities are not compulsory.

Attendance

It is vitally important that your child is in school and on time every day to ensure they are able to make the most of their learning opportunities. Please ensure children are at school **at 8:40am** each day; Truro Class enter through the side gable doors. Children will be dismissed from the playground **at 3:15pm** each day.

From time to time, there may be exceptional circumstances when your child is too poorly to attend school. If this is the case, please inform the school office by 9am each day of absence.

School Uniform

PE and Staying Active

Truro Class PE will take place on a Tuesday. Children need to wear full, named Tregolls PE kit to school every Tuesday, including trainers; they may wear warm layers over the top.

Home Learning

Compulsory Home Learning for Key Stage 2 consists of:

- 20 minutes reading per day (recorded and signed off by an adult in your child's reading planner)
- Varied practice of weekly spellings and their definitions
- Practice of weekly times tables on TT Rockstars
