Attendance

It is vitally important that your reception age child is in school and on time every day to ensure they are able to make the most of their learning opportunities. Please ensure children are in school <u>by 8:40am</u> each day; Reception enter through the double doors in the EYFS playground at 8.35 and these doors close at 8.40, your child will be marked as late if they arrive after this time. Children will be dismissed from this door <u>at 3:10pm</u> each day.

From time to time, there may be exceptional circumstances when your child is too poorly to attend school. If this this the case, please inform the school office by 9am each day of absence.

Essentials

- Please do not bring a water bottle, we will have school ones that we wash daily.
- A sun hat.
- Suncream must be applied in the morning. Children will apply their own at lunch time
 (They will be supervised but please teach them how to do this!)
- A pair of named welly boots will be needed in school EVERY day.
- A waterproof coat should rain be predicted
- Waterproof/puddle suit
- A school book bag with reading books and reading record
- Please do not bring any toys to school, it can be upsetting for children when they get lost

We follow the Early Years Statutory Framework. Our initial focus is the three prime areas.

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED)
- Communication and language (C&L)
- Physical Development (PD)

There are then the 4 specific areas of learning in Early Years;

- Literacy,
- Maths,
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Art and Design.

In Summer 1 our topic is 'What's at the bottom of my garden?' and our Summer 2 topic is 'Seaside'. We have lots of exciting experiences and learning opportunities planned for your children. Communication and Lanauage

We will learn what shop keepers do and practice using the phone in our role play to speak with customers.

Ask and answer questions to find out more information and conflinue conversations. Listen , join in and respond to stories, rhymes and songs. Build up a larger range of songs and rhymes to sing/say from recall. Begin to make up our own and rehearse with others. Physical Development

We will practice holding a pencil correctly and continue daily fine motor activities to develop our fine motor grip. We will practice and refine our scissor skills.

We have access daily to outside where we can use the large equipment to build strength in our upper bodies ready to support our writing development.

We will also take part in weekly PE session where we will be learning ball skills.

We will be following Read. Write. Inc phonics program. By the end of Spring term we will have learnt and practiced the following skills:

We will learn our Set 2 sounds, letter formation, finger spaces,

Continue to read and write captions and develop into short Continue to read and write captions and a develop into short simple sentences for a range of purposes. Learn more HFWs We will use our Drowing Club sessions to help us learn and practice these skills:

Writing for a purpose in role play using phonetically plausible attempts at sentences, beginning to use finger spaces. Form

Our class Books

Maths

We will have daily maths sessions. By the end of the Summer term we will

- we will have adapt in this seasons, by the end of the summer term we have reached the following objectives

 Have a deep understanding of number to 10, including the composition of each number.

 Subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 5.

 Automatically recall (without reference to rhymes, counting or other aids) number bonds up to 5 (including subtraction facts) and some number bonds to 10, including double facts.

 Verbally count beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the counting
- verbally could be young 20, recognising the patient of the coolining system.

 Compare quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when one quantity is greater than, less than or the same as the other

Explore and represent patterns within numbers up to 10, including evens and odds, double facts and how quantities can be distributed equally.

Expressive Art and Design

Exploring the sculptural qualities of malleable materials and natural objects; developing the use of tools and joining techniques; designing and making clay animal sculptures

Paint imaginative designs with salt experimenting with colour and texture

Use small world and puppets to act own narratives

Singing and performing- continue to build a repertoire of songs Explore and engage in music making and dance, performing solo or in groups.

Make sandwiches for a school trip to the beach.
