Curriculum

Our first project throughout the Spring term will be is 'Our Wonderful World' with our big question being 'How can we save the planet?'

PE and Staying Active

Home Learning

Compulsory Home Learning for Key Stage 2 children is posted on our Class Dojo page weekly and consists of:

- Varied practice of weekly spellings and their definitions
- Practice of weekly times tables (including 100 Club practice, TT Rockstars and Speed Tables) Children must bring their reading book and reading diary into school each day. Children can earn extra Dojo points each week by uploading evidence of their Home Learning to their Dojo profiles.

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Geography

Climate and Weather - Children will be introduced to different ways of communicating geographical data, through different styles of maps. They will learn to read weather and climate maps and learn about climate zones.

Our World - Children will begin to understand the Earth better as a sphere and explore its representation in 2-D maps. They will learn about the imaginary lines used to pinpoint global locations.

<u>Literacy</u> This half term the children will be focussing on setting description. We are kickstarting our unit with the text of 'The Snow Queen' This text uses fantastic vocabulary to

inspire children to write their own setting description text based on the structure of 'The Snow Queen'

For our launch day we will be changing our classroom environment to fully engross children in a multisensory experience of a of a setting, giving them an ore and wonder start to the unit.

PE
Gymnastics - Children will combine and perform gymnastic actions, shapes and balan Movement out of different balances. Use of symmetrical and asymmetrical shapes. Use cannon and unison. Plan sequences using floor and apparatus. Evaluate own and others work suggesting ways to improve. Athletics

Throwing – pull, push, sling actions. Jumping for length and height with approach. Running styles and acceleration/pace

Computing

We are Presenters - Children will create an informative presentation linked to our main project. They will source images online to illustrate their presentation and film it against a green screen.

We are who we are - Children will create a set of presentations for different audiences and discuss issues of online trust and privacy.



How can we save the planet?

Music

Children will be exploring rhythm and pitch through singing. During the term they will learn how to sing and perform the song 'Bringing Us Together' in a Disco style working on having greater pitch control. They will also play a simple phrase on the glockenspiel to help develop their sense of rhythm.

Science

Light and Shadows - Children will learn to:

- Recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light.
- Notice that light is reflected from surfaces. •Recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous.
- ·Recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object

Muslims and Islam- This half term the children will be learning about Muslims and Islam.

Children will be learning about the importance of their ritual prayer, why they fast through Ramadan, what the Quran is and how the Mosque helps Muslims to worship God.

PSHE/ French

PSHE - Our PSHE follows our mindful whole-school approach, Jigsaw. Our two topics this term are 'Dreams and Goals' and 'Healthy Me'. Our one-word school rule of 'Respect' will remain a focus.

French - Children will learn key vocabulary about the UK and Paris and they will build on this to be able to have short conversations about these destinations.

Maths

Our Maths No Problem learning will focus on the following areas further multiplication and division, length, mass and volume. We will also incorporate some cross curricular Problem Solving and Reasoning activities linked to our spring project and Science units.

Art/DT

DT: Mechanical Systems - Children will select appropriate equipment and materials to build a working pneumatic system and they will assemble their system within the housing to create the desired motion.

Art: Textiles / weaving / tie dying Children will learn to investigate different ideas by creating a mood board and they will learn to tie-dye,

Launch Day:

We will kick start this topic with our 'The Snow Queen' themed launch day. This will introduce our literacy text and the children will transform our classroom into a winter wonderland. We will also be creating mini ice sculptures and intricate snowflake designs.
